Birth to Three Is Open For Families

The Birth to Three System is accepting referrals during the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency.

- Evaluations and visits can be completed successfully using Remote Early Intervention (EI), which consists of phone interviews and video communication.
- There is a helpful video, and links to a checklist to help you prepare for Remote El visits, accessible here:
 www.birth23.org/covid-19-phe/. Since we are coaching you, it is essential that you are involved during the Remote El visit.

Your programs want to stay open to support you remotely, but if they have to close temporarily, they are not required to make up any services missed while they are closed. If they offer Remote El visits during this time and you decline Remote El visits, the program is not required to make up those visits.

Family Cost Participation fees have been waived by Governor Lamont's Executive Order 70 & OEC Commissioner Bye's Memo #14.

Birth to Three Programs are still required to collect information about family cost participation fees. You will NOT be billed or responsible for any fees for March services and the months that follow until the Executive Order is rescinded. Invoices for services provided before March will have to be paid. Your services will not be suspended for nonpayment of fees during the Public Health Emergency.
